# THE INDIVIDUALIZED LEARNING CENTER

- ◆ Enrollment is limited to 90 students.
- ◆ Teacher to student ratio is 1:15.
- ◆ The program is pass/fail grading system, with 75% and above considered passing.
- ◆ Rockwood School District curriculum and graduation requirements apply.
- ◆ Students are assigned classes each quarter according to their graduation requirements.
- ◆ ILC follows a block schedule with 90 minute class periods.
- ◆ All students are enrolled in four academic classes each quarter for a possible 2 credits per quarter/8 credits per year. Qualifying students may also participate in a work-study program for additional credits.

- ◆ Computer technology is utilized in all classrooms.
- ◆ Completion of Rockwood School District graduation requirements results and a high school diploma issued from the student's home school.
- ◆ ILC complies to all Rockwood School District policies and procedures.

## ILC SCHEDULE

- ◆ Students attend classes:  
Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.
- ◆ Each individual quarter is credited as a complete semester.  
(8 CREDITS PER YEAR)
- ◆ ILC follows the Rockwood School District calendar.



## TARGET GROUPS

This program is beneficial for the following groups of students:

- ◆ Students that are credit deficient in their current high schools.
- ◆ Students that struggle with school anxiety.
- ◆ Students that struggle to stay focused in large classes.
- ◆ Students that are, or have been, involved in treatment or therapy programs.
- ◆ Students who express significant fear or unhappiness at their home high schools.
- ◆ Students that have not given up.
- ◆ Students that are at risk of dropping out.
- ◆ Students that need a little more time to finish high school.
